Roll was called and it was determined a quorum was present.

2. Telephonic Participation vote for Michael Grimmé.

Mr. Grimmé's telephonic participation was approved by consensus.

VOTING ITEMS

1. Election of Chair

Motion was made by Mr. Carlson and seconded by Vice Chair O'Malley to re-elect Chair Iversen as Chair. In a voice vote, motion passed unanimously.

2. Election of Vice Chair

Motion was made by Mr. Carlson and seconded by Mr. Pollitt to re-elect Vice Chair O'Malley. In a voice vote, motion passed unanimously.

3. Approve Minutes of June 26, 2014 Meeting

Motion was made by Mr. Fauer and seconded by Vice Chair O'Malley to approve the minutes. In a voice vote, motion passed unanimously.

4. Approve Minutes of June 30, 2014 Meeting

Motion was made by Mr. Fauer and seconded by Vice Chair O'Malley to approve the minutes. In a voice vote, motion passed unanimously.

5. RFQ 946-11333 – Consultant Competitive Negotiations Act (CCNA) General Aviation Consultant Services – Contract Agreement

Mr. Pollitt informed the board he has a conflict of interest and would abstain from voting (conflict of interest form attached).

Staff recommended that the Board support the City approval of the hourly rates for HDR, Inc. and enter into a contract with HDR, Inc., to serve as the Airport's General Aviation Consultant for a period of up to two (2) years with two one (1) year renewal options. Task orders will be brought back to the Board and City Commission on a project-by-project basis as funding in determined.

Motion was made by Vice Chair O'Malley and seconded by Mr. Volchek to approve the staff recommendation. Motion passed (7-0 and 1 abstained).

6. Airfield Electrical Rehabilitation – Project No. 11997 - Joint Participation Agreement with Florida Department of Transportation

Staff recommended that the JPA be supported by the Board for the City to accept \$464,000 from FDOT for up to 80% of the project costs for providing design and construction services

Motion was made by Mr. Fauer and seconded by Vice Chair O'Malley to approve the staff recommendation. In a voice vote, motion passed unanimously.

7. Master Plan Update – Project No. 12070 - Joint Participation Agreement with Florida Department of Transportation

Staff recommended that the JPA be supported by the Board for the City to accept \$400,000 from the FDOT for up to 80% of the project costs for developing a Master Plan Update for FXE.

Motion was made by Mr. Volchek and seconded by Mr. Fauer to approve the staff recommendation. In a voice vote, motion passed unanimously.

8. Termination of Lease Agreement Parcel 8D Performance Trading Inc.

Staff recommended that the City Commission authorizes the City Manager to terminate the lease for Parcel 8D with Performance Trading, Inc. in accordance with Paragraph 16 of the lease. Staff shall work with the City Attorney's Office to pursue available legal remedies.

Mr. Moody informed the board he has a conflict of interest and would abstain from voting (conflict of interest form attached)

Motion was made by Mr. Kwoka and seconded by Mr. Carlson to approve the staff recommendation. Motion failed (0-7 and 1 abstained).

This form is for use by any person serving at the county, city, or other local level of government on an appointed or elected board, council, commission, authority, or committee. It applies to members of advisory and non-advisory bodies who are presented with a voting conflict of interest under Section 112.3143, Florida Statutes.

Your responsibilities under the law when faced with voting on a measure in which you have a conflict of interest will vary greatly depending on whether you hold an elective or appointive position. For this reason, please pay close attention to the instructions on this form before completing and filing the form.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 112.3143, FLORIDA STATUTES

A person holding elective or appointive county, municipal, or other local public office MUST ABSTAIN from voting on a measure which would inure to his or her special private gain or loss. What is "Part 150"?

- 14 C.F.R Part 150, "Airport Noise Compatibility Planning"
 - Voluntary FAA-defined process for airport noise studies
- Two major components
 - Noise Exposure Map FAA "accepts"
 - Detailed description of airport layout, operations, noise exposure, land uses, and noise/land use compatibility for at least two years
 - Noise Compatibility Program FAA "approves" individual measures
 - Noise abatement measures to reduce noise exposure
 - Land use mitigation measures to address existing non-compatible uses
 - Land use control measures to prevent new non-compatible uses
- Consultation required with users and land use jurisdictions

Part 150 focusses on cumulative ("average") noise levels over an entire year.

Three Prior Part 150 Processes at FXE

1986 Submission

- FAA found NEM in compliance in 1988
- FAA published NCP "Record of Approval" in 1991

1994/6 submission

FAA found NEM in compliance in 1995, published ROA in 1997

2002 submission

■ FAA found NEM in compliance in 2004, published ROA in 2005

Overall result has been a comprehensive noise program


 Including noise abatement, compatible land use, and continuing program elements

■ This submission is an NEM update for 2014 and 2019

 To support City's commitment to monitor operations and noise, and provide up-to-date basis for continued land use planning

Most noise concerns at FXE relate to "single events"


- A-weighted decibel (dBA)
 - Reflects the manner humans hear different pitches of sound
 - Nearly universally used for environmental studies
- Single event metrics
 - Maximum sound level (Lmax)
 - "How loud did it get?"
 - Time-Above threshold (TA)
 - "How long will it affect me?"
 - Sound Exposure Level (SEL)
 - Noise "dose" over entire event



- FAA will not base Part 150 reviews on single event levels
 - Requires consideration of total annual noise exposure
 - Day-Night Average Sound Level

Day-Night Average Sound Level ("DNL" or "Ldn")


- Measure of cumulative noise
- Equal to steady level that contains same energy as the actual time-varying sound
- 10 dB "penalty" on sounds from 10 pm to 7 am
- Nearly every state and federal agency uses for land use compatibility purposes
- Part 150 provides compatibility
 "guidelines" City has adopted
- All land uses are considered compatible outside 65 DNL




Noise Modeling

- Part 150 requires that noise exposure be determined using the FAA's Integrated Noise Model ("INM")
 - Results presented in the form of noise contours
- Noise modeling inputs include:
 - Average daily arrivals and departures
 - By aircraft type
 - By time of day
 - Arrival and departure "cockpit" procedures
 - Airfield layout
 - Percentage use of runways (by aircraft type and time of day)
 - Flight track geometry and use (by aircraft type and time of day)
 - Meteorological data
- FXE "ANOMS" provides excellent, objective data


Draft 2014 NEM

Comparison of 2014 and 2002 NEMs



Major Conclusions

- Contours have shrunk approximately 5 dB since 2002
- No noncompatible land use within 65 dB DNL
 - Why?
 - Fewer operations overall
 - Retirement of older noisier Part 36 "stage 1 and 2" jets


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


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
Noise Monitor Locations




Jet Arrival Flight Tracks




Jet Departure Flight Tracks




Propeller Arrival Flight Tracks
