2. Fort Lauderdale Executive Airport Parcels 19B, 25, 26, & 27 - Zoning Text Amendment

Jim Hetzel, Planner III, Planning and Zoning Department provided background information on the proposed zoning amendments.

Staff recommended amending the text of the General Aviation Airport (GAA) zoning district to allow Limited Recreational Uses as a Conditional Use as stated in the proposed text amendment

Motion was made by Mr. Kwoka and seconded by Mr. Kerney to support staff's recommendation. In a voice vote, motion passed unanimously.

3. Fort Lauderdale Executive Airport Parcels 19B, 25, 26, & 27 - Zoning Map Amendment

Jim Hetzel, Planner III, Planning and Zoning Department provided background information on the proposed zoning amendments.

Staff recommended that the City amend the Zoning Map for Parcels 19B from Commerce Center (CC) zoning designation to General Aviation Airport (GAA); and Parcels 25, 26, and 27 from Park, Recreation, and Open Space (P) zoning designation to General Aviation Airport (GAA).

Motion was made by Mr. Kerney and seconded by Vice Chair O'Malley to support staff's recommendation. In a voice vote, motion passed unanimously.

4. Cancellation and Re-award of Contract for Painting of the John Fuhrer Downtown Helistop – Invitation to Bid (ITB 532-11229)

Staff recommended cancelling the contract with Fitch Builders Incorporated and awarding the contract to Roof Painting by Hartzell in the amount of \$95,268.
