A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE FINAL OPERATING BUDGET OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2012, AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2013, BY APPROPRIATING FUNDS AS SET FORTH IN CITY COMMISSION AGENDA MEMO #13-0539 AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 12-175, adopted on September 18, 2012, the City Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale adopted the Final Operating Budget of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2012, and ending September 30, 2013,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That the Final Operating Budget of the City of Fort Lauderdale for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2012, and ending September 30, 2013, is hereby amended by appropriating funds as set forth in Commission Agenda Memo #13-0539, copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.

SECTION 2. That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon final passage.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution amending the Fiscal Year 2013 Budget.

Background

Budget amendments were previously submitted as separate agenda items and listed throughout the City Commission Agenda. Amendments are now consolidated into one agenda item for consideration at the first meeting of each month.

Examples of recommended actions within the consolidated budget amendment are:

- transfer between funds;
- transfer between capital and operating budgets;
- transfer between capital projects;
- · acceptance and appropriation of grant funding;
- appropriation from fund balance; and
- appropriation for modified revenue and related expenditures.

Staff is recommending that the City Commission amend the FY 2013 Operating Budgets by approving the following transfers and appropriations:

City Manager

A. Acceptance and appropriation of grant funding – Grants Fund – 2013 Community Foundation of Broward Inc. Re-engage for Good City Challenge Grant - \$30,000

The Community Foundation of Broward Inc. awarded a 2013 Re-engage for Good City Challenge Grant, to the City of Fort Lauderdale for the Volunteer Services Network project. Initiatives supported by this grant include pedestrian safety and a cross-generational mentorship program. The grant acceptance is a companion item on this agenda, CAM 13-0674.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2013 operating budget by amending the appropriate revenue accounts in the amount of \$30,000 for the City of Fort Lauderdale Re-engage for Good City Challenge Grant.

Fire-Rescue

B. Appropriation between grant projects and operating budgets – Grants Fund – Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) - \$1,237.10

Expenditures related to this grant were submitted for approval from the U.S Department of Homeland Security/Federal Emergency Management Agency. Upon review of the expenses, some expenses were not eligible for payment under this grant. Expenses in the amount of \$1,237.10 must be refunded to the grant.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2013 operating budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the amount of \$1,237.10 to repay the grant fund for the ineligible expenses.

Parks and Recreation

C. Appropriation and transfer between capital projects – General Capital Projects Fund – Holiday Park Gym Roof - \$174,132

The Holiday Park gymnasium's roof is over twenty years old and is in desperate need of replacement. Over the years, repairs have been made mostly due to leaks. However, the current condition of the roof exceeds repair and a new roof is recommended to ensure safety and structural integrity of the building. Funding for the new roof will be transferred from completed projects. A work order to detail the roof replacement will be presented to the City Commission May 21, 2013, CAM 13-0625.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2013 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the amount \$174,132 to facilitate replacement of the roof for the gymnasium at Holiday Park.

D. Appropriation from fund balance - Cemetery Perpetual Care Trust - Sunset Memorial Gardens Paving - \$100,000

On January 10, 2013, the Cemetery Board of Trustees voted to approve expenditures not to exceed \$100,000 from the Cemetery Perpetual Care Trust Fund to repave and restore the roads at Sunset Memorial Gardens. The contract to award the vendor is a companion on this agenda, CAM 13-0402.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2013 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the amount \$100,000 to facilitate funding of the repaving and restoration of the Sunset Memorial Gardens roads and associated estimated engineering fees.

E. Acceptance and appropriation of grant funding – Grants Fund – Summer Food Program - \$103,275.90

The City has been awarded the Summer Food Program grant from the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. This grant reimburses the City for lunch meals, snacks, and operational expenses required to operate the food program from June to August 2013. Meal services are offered at Bass, Carter, Croissant, Riverside, Warfield, Lauderdale Manors, Osswald, and Riverland Parks. The award acceptance is a companion on this agenda, CAM 13-0647.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2013 operating budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the amount of \$103,275.90 to operate the Summer Food Program.

Public Works

F. Transfer between capital budgets – General Capital Projects Fund – 2013-2014 Annual Ocean Regulatory Buoys - \$107,972.12

The annual replacement of navigational signs and buoys is currently out to bid. The cost estimates are not expected to exceed \$107,972.12. Funding to complete the annual project will be transferred from a completed project that will be closed.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2013 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the amount of \$107,972.12 to facilitate the funding of the Annual Ocean Regulatory Buoys & Navigational Sign Repairs project.

G. Appropriation from fund balance – General Fund - Florida East Coast (FEC) Railway licenses and maintenance - \$8,544

As part of the long-term agreements between the City and Florida East Coast (FEC) Railway, LLC and Flagler Development Group (a subsidiary of FEC), the City is required to pay for thirty-five licenses to use certain portions of the FEC Railway properties for utility crossings. In addition, the City is responsible for maintenance and rehabilitation of ten FEC Railway, LLC signal crossings throughout the City. The City Commission

approved two invoices at the November 6, 2012 (CAM 12-2304) in the amount of \$20,091.72. Three additional invoices have been received in the amount of \$8,544, for signal maintenance of Riverwalk (\$4,272), SW 17th Street (\$2,136) and SW 15th Street (\$2,136).

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2013 operating budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the amount \$8,544 to pay for expenses related to the FEC Railway licenses and crossings.

H. Appropriation from fund balance and transfer between capital projects – Water and Sewer General Capital Projects - Annual Utilities Restoration 2013 Contract – \$402,000

The Annual Utilities Restoration contract provides repair and emergency services for the water and sewer infrastructures that require specialized equipment or for major roadways that carry significant traffic and require extensive maintenance of traffic (MOT) modifications to execute the work. Projected cost of the annual contract is not expected to exceed \$402,000. Funding will be transferred from the fund balance and carry over from the previous year annual contract. The contract will be awarded at the May 21, 2013 City Commission meeting.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2013 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the amount of \$402,000 to facilitate the funding of the Annual Utilities Restoration project.

Sustainable Development

I. Appropriation between capital projects – NW Progresso Flagler Heights CRA CIP NW Neighborhood Pedestrian Path Improvements - \$2,849.53

Expenditures related to this projected were submitted to the U.S. Department of Transportation for review under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) grant. Upon review of the expenses, \$2,849.53 of expenses were determined to be ineligible. To ensure seamless financial accounting, a reimbursement of these funds from a near complete project is necessary to prevent further interruptions in the completion of this project.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2013 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the amount of \$2,849.53 to fund the reimbursement of the project for the ineligible expenses.

J. Appropriation from fund balance – General Fund – Repayment to Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for HOME Investment Partnership Program ineligible expenses- \$70,518.82

In an effort to restore the City's ability to receive funding from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for HOME Investment Partnership projects, it is recommended that the City repay HUD for incomplete or ineligible HOME project activities

totaling \$70,518.82. The approval of the repayment of the HOME funding is a companion item on this agenda, CAM 13-0229.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2013 operating budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the amount of \$70,518.82 to repay HUD for ineligible HOME Investment Partnership Project expenses.

Transportation and Mobility

K. Appropriation from fund balance – Gas Tax and Parking System Funds – Downtown Transit Circulator (Wave Streetcar) Project - \$1,100,000

On April 16, 2013 (CAM 12-2525), City Commission approved a motion to appropriate funding to the Wave Streetcar project in the amount of \$1,100,000. Staff recommends a ratification of this previous City Commission action.

The Wave is a 2.7 mile electric streetcar system that will serve as a local circulator in Downtown Fort Lauderdale. The system will have 10 solar powered stations and will feature real time information, informational kiosks displaying destinations/attractions in the Downtown, as well as upcoming community events. The City has committed to funding in the amount of \$10.5 million, \$9.4 million in cash/land donations and \$1.1 million from fund balances. The Interlocal Partnership Agreement was approved at the April 16, 2013 City Commission meeting (CAM 12-2525).

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2013 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the amount \$1,100,000 to facilitate the construction of the Wave Streetcar Project.
