### AMENDED ORDINANCE

#### ORDINANCE NO. C-09-12

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA. APPROVING A SMALL SCALE LAND USE MAP AMENDMENT TO THE 2008 FORT LAUDERDALE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN TO CHANGE THE LAND USE DESIGNATION FROM PARK-OPEN SPACE TO COMMUNITY FACILITIES, A 1.3 ACRE, MORE OR LESS, PARCEL OF LAND IN THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF TRACT "A", "LAKE LAUDERDALE RECREATION AREA", ACCORDING TO THE PLAT THEREOF, RECORDED IN PLAT BOOK 134, PAGE 38. OF THE PUBLIC RECORDS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA. LOCATED ON THE NORTH SIDE NORTHWEST 19TH STREET BETWEEN NORTHWEST 15TH AVENUE AND INTERSTATE I-95, IN FORT LAUDERDALE, BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, AND MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED IN COMPOSITE EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED HERETO, AND REQUESTING THE BROWARD COUNTY PLANNING COUNCIL TO RECERTIFY THE AMENDMENT.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. C-08-18 adopted by the City Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale on May 6, 2008, the City Commission adopted the 2008 Fort Lauderdale Comprehensive Plan for the City of Fort Lauderdale ("Plan"); and

WHEREAS, an application has been submitted to amend the City's Land Use Plan to change the designation of certain land as more particularly described in Composite Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein, located on the north side of N.W. 19<sup>th</sup> Street between N.W. 15<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Interstate I-95; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Board, acting as the City's Local Planning Agency, at its meeting of June 18, 2008 recommended that the City Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale deny the proposed Comprehensive Plan amendment as provided herein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 08-135 adopted on July 1, 2008, the City Commission approved the transmittal of the small scale amendment to the Broward County Planning Council and requested amendment of the Broward County Land Use Plan Map; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Lauderdale wishes to adopt the proposed amendment to the City of Fort Lauderdale Comprehensive Plan as provided herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:

- <u>SECTION 1</u>. That the Comprehensive Plan shall be amended by revising the Land Use Map to change the land use of the land described in Composite Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein, from Park/Open Space to Community Facilities.
- SECTION 2. That conditioned upon Broward County Planning Council recertifying this land use amendment, certain property known as Fire Station 46 on the date this Ordinance is adopted, legally described in Exhibit "B" attached hereto, shall be used as a passive pocket park and improvements will be made to Mills Pond Park as provided in Exhibit "C".
- <u>SECTION 3</u>. That if any clause, section or other part of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby, but shall remain in full force and effect.
- <u>SECTION 4</u>. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.
- <u>SECTION 5</u>. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon the date when the compliance review requirements as provided in Chapter 163, Florida Statutes, and the Broward County Planning Council recertification requirements have been met.



### FIRE STATION NO. 46

A portion of tract "A" "Lake Lauderdale Recreation Area" according to the plat thereof, recorded in Plat Book 134, page 38, of the public records of Broward County, Florida; being described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the west line of Parcel 3, "Parkway Distribution and Industrial Center", as recorded in Plat 87, Page 13, of the public records of said Broward County with the south boundary of said tract "A"; thence North 00°07'44" West along a west line of said Tract "A" a distance of 215.17 feet; thence North 89° 52'16" East a distance of 186.67 feet; thence South 00°07'44" East a distance of 50.00 feet; thence North 89° 52'16" East a distance of 99.17 feet; thence South 00°07'44" East a distance 172.50 feet to a point on the south boundary of said Tract "A"; thence along said south boundary North 81°18'25" West a distance of 36.28 feet; thence continuing along said south boundary North 89°50'16" West a distance of 250.00 feet to the Point of Beginning.

Said lands situate, lying and being in the City of Fort Lauderdale, Broward County Florida, containing 56,826 square feet, or 1.305 acres, more or less.

# **FIRE STATION 46**

Improvements to Mills Pond Park shall be constructed in conjunction with or prior to the Fire Station 46 construction are as follows:

- Relocation and rehabilitation of three existing multipurpose play fields.
- Installation of upgraded field lighting.
- Upgrading irrigation system.
- Installation of new sod.
- Construction of a new restroom/concession building in a location adjacent to fields.
- Construction of a new maintenance storage building for housing equipment and apparatus utilized in the maintenance of the park.
- Construction of additional parking adjacent to play fields.
- Installation of new security fencing at the southern park boundary.
