LOCAL RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Lauderdale values its citizens as stated in its "Fast Forward Fort Lauderdale Vision" and recognizes that consumers want information about the food they and their families eat; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Lauderdale values education, transparency, and accessibility, and recognizes that the labeling of genetically engineered foods is a 'right to know' issue, serving to inform citizens; and

WHEREAS, there are 64 countries that enforce labeling laws for genetically engineered food; and

WHEREAS, the states of Connecticut, Maine, and Vermont have passed laws requiring the labeling of GE foods; and

WHEREAS, as of July 2014, more than 60 bills have been introduced in over 20 states to require GE labeling; and

WHEREAS, farmers who produce organic or non-genetically engineered crops are exposed to the risk of crop contamination from nearby genetically engineered crops; and

WHEREAS, farmers who unintentionally grow genetically engineered-patented seeds or who harvest crops that are contaminated with genetically engineered traits could lose their organic certification and face costly lawsuits; and

WHEREAS, a 2013 *New York Times* poll found that 93 percent of U.S. consumers wanted all genetically engineered ingredients to be identified;
