Certified mail sent to the owner was accepted on 10/3/11. Service was also via posting at City Hall on 10/6/11.

Ingrid Gottlieb, Senior Code Enforcement Officer, testified to the following violations: 9-276(c)(3)

THERE IS EVIDENCE OF TERMITES, INCLUDING CLEARLY VISIBLE AREAS OF EATEN WOOD AND SAWDUST.

9-280(b)

THERE IS A DOOR ON THE HOUSE THAT HAS DETERIORATED TO THE POINT OF NO LONGER BEING WEATHERPROOF AND WATER TIGHT AS REQUIRED, DUE TO TERMITES. THERE IS TERMITE EATEN AND ROTTED FASCIA BOARD AND WOOD PIECES ON THE STRUCTURE.

Officer Gottlieb said the owner was present to request time to comply.

Mr. Phillip Ragsdale, owner, said he had treated the termite problem himself. He said people from his church had promised to help him if he could get 30 days.

Officer Gottlieb presented photos of the property and the case file into evidence, and recommended ordering compliance within 91 days or a fine of \$25 per day, per violation.

Judge Purdy found in favor of the City and ordered compliance within 91 days or a fine of \$25 per day, per violation would begin to accrue and ordered the respondent to reappear at that hearing.
